The Central Nottinghamshire Hospitals' project involves the design, construction and operation of two major hospitals on two sites, providing 840 beds. Firstly, King's Mill Hospital, in Sutton-in-Ashfield will be extensively redeveloped to create a single unified hospital comprising 28 new wards - 50% in single rooms, a new state-of-the-art Diagnostic and Treatment Centre, an Emergency Care and Assessment Centre with an out of hours GP service and a dedicated Women's & Children's Centre.

The hospital will enjoy a southerly aspect providing light and airy accommodation with views of the reservoir and countryside beyond.

Mansfield Community Hospital, which is just one mile from the town centre, has been designed to be a landmark for the community it serves with access for both pedestrians and vehicles being greatly improved.

Throughout the phased construction period existing healthcare facilities will remain fully operational. As a result, the Project has required £40m of enabling works, including temporary buildings and extensive car parking. Skanska's design team provided a full range of civil, structure and infrastructure services to this major acute hospital.

Each aspect of these works, along with the future main build, forms part of a sustainable drainage solution, designed by Skanska's team, providing a better environment for the hospital and local community.

Skanska's design team has been the driving force behind the expansion of the design risk process beyond the legislative requirement of CDM, raising awareness of the construction teams to residual risks and significantly contributing to the Skanska goal of zero accidents.

The experiences from the design of a number of previous healthcare projects has allowed Skanska to influence the design and construction teams through challenging interventions, and bringing added value to the project.□
